

Camp Flashback Procedures during the COVID-19 Pandemic

Drop-off/Arrival procedure:

➤ **Before Arrival:** We ask that you be on the alert for any symptoms of COVID-19 and keep your child at home if they show any signs of illness. If possible, the same parent or designated person should drop off and pick up your child every day. Avoid designating those considered at high risk such as elderly grandparents who are over 65 years of age.

➤ **Upon Arrival:** Since a significant portion of individuals with coronavirus lack symptoms, it is highly recommended that your child wears a cloth face covering as a precautionary measure to avoid the spreading of any virus between people interacting in proximity. For example: speaking, coughing, or sneezing—even if those people are not exhibiting symptoms related to Covid-19. Although we will emphasize the maintaining of 6-feet social distancing when in large groups or around presenters, it is important that you make sure your child's name is on their face covering. Campers will be required to wear facial coverings when appropriate to the activity and location of Campers within the camp facility. Without a proper facial covering, they may not be allowed to participate in some activities.

➤ **To drop and pick up your child:** Enter at the Chamblee-Dunwoody Road entrance. Drive up the driveway and drop your child off in front of the tent. A staff person will greet you and your child. Persons dropping-off and picking-up Campers must remain in their vehicles.

➤ **Before your child exits the car:** You will be asked the following questions:

- Do you or do any of the children you are dropping off have a fever, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, other respiratory symptoms, or at least two of the following:
 - symptoms: chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell?
 - Have you or any of the children you are dropping off had any of these symptoms since last time you were last here?
 - Been in contact with anyone with these symptoms since the last time you were here?
 - Potentially been exposed** to COVID-19 or have reason to believe you/they have COVID-19?

You will NOT be allowed to leave your child if the answer is yes to any of the above questions.

➤ **After your child has exited the car:** A staff member will make a visual inspection of your child for signs of infection such as flushed cheeks, fatigue, or extreme fussiness and conduct a temperature screening using a touchless thermometer. Any Camper temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, other respiratory symptoms, or at least two of the following symptoms: chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell will NOT be allowed to attend camp.

➤ **After the screening:** You may exit on to Vermack Road.

➤ **At that point:** Your child's designated counselor will walk your child to wash their hands (Hand sanitizing products may be used in lieu of handwashing) and join their assigned group which will consist of 8 other students where they will remain in the same group for the duration of the camp.

During the day your child will:

➤ Wash their hands frequently with soap and water in between all activities. Hand sanitizing products may be used in lieu of handwashing. In addition, all campers will be required to wash hands:

- upon arrival in the morning
- before and after eating meals and snacks
- after blowing noses, coughing, or sneezing or when in contact with body fluids
- after using the toilet facilities

➤ It will be required that your child brings their own lunch and snacks with them to camp each day, with all such food items being in a sealed lunch bag that contains a cool pack to help keep their lunch cool and have their name marked on the bag along with a water bottle marked with their name.

➤ Social Distancing between groups will be enforced, prohibiting gatherings, and prohibiting congregating among campers belonging to different groups in a space where all persons gathered cannot maintain at least six (6) feet of distance between themselves and any other person.

➤ A designated space will be provided for each Camper to store personal belongings and projects that need to be completed throughout the duration of the camp.

➤ Only one group will be permitted to use camp equipment at a time such as materials used for crafts or playground equipment. All equipment will be sanitized after each group use. Each group will have their own disinfectant and cleaning supplies (hand sanitizer, soap for handwashing, disinfectant cleaners and paper towels).

➤ The cleaning and sanitizing all frequently touched surfaces will be done regularly throughout the day. Restrooms will be sanitized no less than twice per day.

➤ Guest speakers of Camp Flashback will be provided masks and will be required to maintain social distancing of 6-feet when around campers and counselors as much as possible.

These practices are aligned with the Governors Executive Order and with CDC guidelines for summer day camps during the COVID-19 health crisis and must be exercised by all. One of the many benefits of Camp Flashback is our small size. We have a maximum of 25-30 campers per week.

While it is our intention to provide a great setting for your child to enjoy carefree summer fun and adventure, their safety is our number one priority. If your child does not follow the proper guidelines after repetitive behavior of not complying, a time out period will be given to your child followed by a phone conference with the parent. If your child continues to misbehave, he or she may be asked to leave without any refunds for the duration of their time enrolled.

We thank you for your cooperation as we navigate through this health emergency. As Camp approaches, we will continue to review the guidelines that we need to follow to maintain safety for all and keep you informed of any changes. In the coming weeks, you will be receiving further information along with

several forms and a parent handbook in preparation for your child's experience at Camp Flashback. If you have any questions, please let us know.
