




1898 Photo of early Dunwoody School which was built in the late 1800s







John Austin was paid 25 cents per week to open the church, sweep the floors, set out a glass of water for the preacher, and to ring the bell 30 minutes before the church service









This bell was given to Dunwoody UMC by Ike Roberts, conductor of the Roswell Railroad for 40 years




